Judy Kraatz has been successfully leading the social and affordable housing program of research with SBEnrc since 2014, and is a Senior Research Fellow with the Cities Research Institute at Griffith University. Over this time Judy has expanded the partner base for this research and helped to successfully translate this research into practice.

This builds on industry experience as a practicing registered Architect from 1987 to 2005, including working on the design of public buildings, and leading teams to deliver city-wide sustainable solutions for public infrastructure. Judy completed a PhD in value mapping and urban development in 2009 at the Queensland University of Technology.
